WHAT TO EXPECT

HOURLY EXPECTATIONS: Each participant is expected to work at least 50 hours in their assigned ministry doing ministry-related activities as agreed upon by them and the Student Ministry Pastor. Each participant will also invest approximately 10-12 hours a week in the study portion of the program.

WHAT TO EXPECT

THE DURATION: Student Life Internships will begin in either June or September. Each participant will be expected to work two full years from their start date.

EDUCATION: You will be attending Discovery classes at CPC as well as weekly meetings with the Student Ministry Pastor and other interns to study and learn ministry skills in a classroom
